# Why Me Lord?

#### Introduction:

- 1. Job 14:1 "Man who is born of woman is of few days and full of trouble."
  - a. Life has its problems.
  - b. NASV & NKJV (footnote) has "full of turmoil".
- 2. <u>Problems come in a variety of packages:</u>
  - a. Sin is the first and greatest problem.
  - b. With self.
  - c. Family problems.
    - i. Marriage.
    - ii. Children.
  - d. Suffer sickness, disease, tragedy and death.
  - e. Financial problems.
  - f. Church problems:
    - i. Division.
    - ii. Indifference.
- 3. <u>Tendency to ask, "Why me Lord?" when life deals us a bad hand.</u>
  - a. "What have I done to deserve this?"
  - b. "Why did God let this happen?"
  - c. "Why am I being punished?"
- 4. <u>Seldom do we ask these questions:</u>
  - a. "Why not me?"
  - b. "Why me?" when receive good or are blessed.
- 5. <u>Begin a serious of studies: Overcoming Some Of Life's Problems</u>.
- 6. <u>Look at question of "Why me Lord?"</u> each of the three words point to the three things we want to notice.
  - a. **Why -** Reasons for problems.
  - b. **Me** The one who suffers.

c. **Lord** - Blaming God.

### I. WHY - Reasons For Problems

### A. Consequences of sin in the Beginning

- 1. Death & disease come as a consequence of sin (Gen. 2:17; 3:1ff).
- 2. 1 Cor. 15:22, 55-56.
- 3. Reason we have sickness, aches, pains, suffering and death is that sin is in the world.
- B. Consequences of our own sin
  - 1. 1 Pet. 4:15-16 suffer as a murderer, etc.
  - 2. Prov. 13:15 way of the transgressor is hard.
  - 3. Reap what sow.
    - a. Gal. 6:7-9 read what sow
    - b. Hosea 8:7 sow to the wind and reap whirlwind.

### C. Consequences of others' sin

- 1. Exo. 20:5-6 consequences visited unto the third and fourth generation.
- 2. Matt. 5:32 man unscripturally puts away his wife she either cannot remarry or commits adultery when she does.
- 3. Ezra 10:44 children suffered because of the parents.
- D. For Cause of Christ
  - 1. 1 Pet. 4:16- suffer as a Christian.
  - 2. Heb. 13:5ff persecution called chastening of the Lord.
  - 3. 2 Tim. 3:12 all that are godly will suffer.
- E. Violation of natural laws
  - 1. Gravity a good law, yet if one falls, can get hurt or possibly die.
  - 2. Fire good to cook and heat, yet burns our bodies or house.
  - 3. Can't have **good** without there also being **bad**.
    - a. If possible to feel good there must also be possibility of feeling bad.
    - b. If possible to have good marriage possible to have a bad one.
- F. Natural phenomena
  - 1. Earthquake, tornado, hurricane, lightening, and floods are all natural occurances.
  - 2. Suffering caused by these are to any and all who are there.

### G. Free will of man

- 1. If man can make choices, then he can make wrong choices, otherwise, we would be robots at the direction of God.
- 2. Choice means there are consequences.
- 3. Thus, possible to blunder and make mistakes or even sin.
- 4. Some choices bring grief and suffering.

### II. ME - The One Who Suffers

- A. All men suffer
  - 1. 1 Pet. 4:15-16 evil doers & Christians.
  - 2. Rom. 8:22 whole creation groans.

### B. Righteous suffer too

- 1. Job
  - a. Blameless and upright (Job. 1:8).
  - b. Yet suffered:
    - (1) Loss of property (Job 1:14, 16, 17).
    - (2) Loss of servants (Job 1:15, 18).
    - (3) Loss of children (Job 1:18).
    - (4) Loss of health (Job 2:1-10).
    - (5) Wife is no help (Job 2:9).
    - (6) Friends turn on him (Job 3-42:6).
- 2. David Psa. 55:1-7
- 3. Lord himself
  - a. Rejected (John 1:11).
  - b. Beaten (Matt. 26:67).
  - c. Ridiculed (Matt. 26:68; 27:31).
  - d. Betrayed (Luke 22:47-53).
  - e. Crucified (Luke 23:26-49).
- 4. Paul
  - a. Persecuted (2 Cor. 11:22-33).
  - b. Thorn in the flesh (2 Cor. 12:7-10).
- 5. All Christians
  - a. Heb. 12:6 scourges every son.
  - b. 2 Tim. 3:12 all who live godly will suffer.
  - c. Rom. 8:16-18 those who are children of God suffer with him.

## III. LORD - Blaming God

### A. God doesn't want bad for man

- 1. He wants all to be saved (1 Tim. 2:9; 2 Pet. 3:10).
- 2. Gave his only Son for us (John 3:16).

### B. Why do people blame God?

### 1. Equate problems with punishment for sin.

- a. This is an old misconception.
  - (1) John 9:1 disciples thought man was blind due to his sin or his parents.
  - (2) Acts 28:4 native of the island that Paul must be a murderer since the snake bit him.
  - (3) Job 3:1ff Job's friends thought he must have done wrong.
- b. Suffering is not due to own sin.
  - (1) Luke 13:1-5
  - (2) Job
  - (3) Heb. 4:15
  - (4) 1 Pet. 2:19ff suffer wrongfully.

### 2. Too high an opinion of own righteousness.

- a. Seen in questions, "What did I do to deserve this...?"
- b. The "Why me?" questions suggest that we thing we have lived in such a way that we do deserve better.

### 3. Selfish

- a. Focus only on self.
- b. If other suffer that's fine, but not me!

### 4. **Removes Guilt**

- a. As in dealing with others if we can point a finger of blame, we feel less guilty ourselves.
- b. So, if I can blame God, we remove any of the guilt that I have had.

### **Conclusion:**

1. All men do suffer - even righteous people.

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- 2. Causes are varied.
- 3. But certainly, God cannot be blamed.

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
