

When You Play With Fire...



Intro:

- 1. Prov. 6:27 If play with fire you get burned.
 - a. Context deals with immorality.
 - b. General principle is set forth here.

2. <u>Point of proverb</u>:

- a. Danger.
- b. Consequences to action.
- c. Our intent may not be what we do.
- d. Hurt self & others.
- 3. Quiet often a person will do something and someone says, "He's playing with fire" means to flirt with danger
 - a. What do, though it may not be wrong, may carry us closer to the wrong.
 - b. By playing with fire our resistence to temptation and sin is weakened.
- 4. <u>Let's apply this principle to our relationship</u> (close relationships). Let's look at some ways people play with fire.

I. Who We Associate With As Friends

- A. Close friends / those we draw closer to...
 - 1. Prov. 19:14, 19; Acts 10:24
 - 2. These will influence you and thus you become like them.
- B. The warning to watch our associations
 - 1. Mixed multitude (Exo. 12:38; Num. 11:4; 13:3).
 - 2. Exo. 23:2, 23
 - 3. Prov. 1:10-19
 - 4. Prov. 4:14-19
 - 5. Prov. 12:26
 - 6. Prov. 22:24-25
 - 7. Prov. 23:20-21
 - 8. 1 Cor. 15:33

- C. Play with fire when those who are close companion (those you "hang with") do not have the same or similar standards that we ought to have.
 - 1. Many those who have gone astray will tell you it started with the "wrong crowd".
 - 2. Young people do not understand why their parents will not allow / discourage close relationship with the world.

II. Who We Marry

- A. Who One Marries is serious.
 - 1. This is the one that you will be the closest to.
 - 2. This is the one who influences you the most.
 - 3. This is the one who will have the greatest impact upon your children.
 - 4. Marriage is permenant (1 Cor. 7:10-13; Matt. 19:4-6).
- B. *Not wrong to marry a non-Christian* (1 Cor. 7:12-ff).
- C. Yet there is danger and we are playing with fire when do.
 - 1. Greater chance that your mate will lead you away.
 - a. Statistics Church in Miami, OK kept records for 20 yrs:
 - (1) Those who married <u>non-Christians</u>:
 - (a) Total: 79
 - (b) Left Lord:57
 - (c) Faithful: 22
 - (d) Converted mate: 14
 - (e) Divored:25
 - (2) Those who married Christians:
 - (a) Total: 64
 - (b) Left Lord: 5
 - (c) Faithful: 59
 - (d) Divorce: 2
 - b. Deut. 7:1-ff
 - c. Samson's problems came with foreign women (Judges 13-16).
 - d. Neh. 13:26 Solomon (cf. 1 Kings 11).
 - 2. Means that you will not share greatest part of your life ("Fear of God") with the one love the most.
 - 3. Raising children can be a conflict.

III. Who We Date

A. Dating in our society is a prelude to love & marriage.

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- 1. Dating leads to love and love leads to marriage.
- 2. Never will marry one don't date.
- 3. Every one date is a possibility for marriage.
- B. One must be careful about who he/she dates.
 - 1. One who would not make a good mate
 - a. One who has no initiative.
 - b. One who is lazy.
 - c. One with an attitude that is sour.
 - d. One who doesn't treat you fair & with consideration.
 - ** Not going to get better....!
 - 2. Non-Christian.
 - 3. One who is bound (having no right to marry).
 - a. Rom. 7:2-3.
 - b. One who can't scripturally marry has no more right to date than one who is married!
 - 4. One who does not fear God
 - a. May be baptized & attend worship and yet not fear God.
 - b. A weak Christian can be worse than a non-Christian!

IV. What We Do With The Opposite Sex

- A. Petting.
 - 1. Anything short of fornication.
 - 2. 2 Tim. 2:22; Matt. 5:28.
 - 3. Any passage on fleeing fornication is a passage that forbids petting (1 Cor. 6:18; 1 Thess. 4:3).
- B. How intimate we become.
 - 1. Gen. 39:11
 - 2. Conversations where we tell our feeling; discuss our marital problems.
 - 3. Embrace / touch (those in vulnerable situation)
 - a. Boss / secretary.
 - b. Preacher / one he counsels.
 - 4. Possible to leave wrong impression.
 - 5. Bond (Rom. 7:2-3) obligates us to our mate and restrains us from all others.
 - 6. Prov. 5:8
