

TOUR HOSTS:



DAY ONE, Friday Oct 30 -- CHICAGO/ ISTANBUL

Today we meet at O' Hare International Airport in Chicago to board our wide body jet. Dinner and breakfast are served on board as we wing our way to Istanbul and a journey into the biblical past.

DAY TWO, Saturday Oct 31 -- ISTANBUL / ADANA / ANTAKYA

This morning we arrive in Istanbul and then fly diagonally across Turkey to Adana, known as the "biggest village in Turkey" due to its rural atmosphere. We proceed by bus to Antakya, ancient Syrian Antioch on the Orontes River.

Christian roots go deep into Antioch's history. It was to Antioch that many Jerusalem Christians fled after the stoning of Stephen (Acts 11:19-27). Paul and Barnabas taught in Antioch for a year and built a strong church there. Later, the city became the center to which Paul returned from his missionary journeys (Acts 13:1-2; 14:26; 15:22-41; 18:22-23). Here Jesus' followers were first labeled "Christians." We visit the Senpiyer Kilisesi, the grotto Church of St. Peter. Tradition says this cave belonged to St. Luke, who was from Antioch, and that he donated it to the burgeoning Christian congregation as a place of worship. Before we return to Adana for dinner and overnight, we'll make a stop at the beach where Paul so often sailed from on his labors for the Lord.

DAY THREE, Sunday Nov 1 -- ADANA / TARSUS / CAPPADOCIA

We visit Tarsus, birthplace of Saul of Tarsus who became the Apostle Paul (Acts 21:39-22:3). We'll see St. Paul's Wheel and the foundations stones of what is believed to be Paul's family home in Tarsus. Then we head north over the Taurus Mountains to Cappadocia. Already we can see the terrain changing from the lowlands of the coast to the highlands of central Turkey. Cappadocia is like no other place on earth. You'll never forget the days you spend in this part of Turkey. We arrive at our fabulous hotel for dinner and overnight.

DAY FOUR, Monday Nov 2 -- CAPPADOCIA / GOREME VALLEY

Successive eruptions of now extinct volcanoes have left Cappadocia covered in multi-colored layers of volcanic rock. This soft rock has been transformed by the winds of erosion into a haunting, surrealistic landscape of caves, columns and canyons. For a thousand years Christians cut chapels and houses in the rock. Frescoes depicting Biblical scenes remain.

In New Testament times Cappadocia was known as Galatia; Paul wrote one of his epistles to the Christians in this area. Three of the most important theologians of the Eastern Orthodox Church lived in the fourth century and hailed from this region. Basil the Great, bishop of Caesarea; his brother Gregory, bishop of Nysa; and another Gregory, bishop of Sasina are known as "the Cappadocian Fathers."

We begin our exploration in the Goreme Valley which contained a monastic community and several rockhewn churches dating from the 9th-13th century. Our full day of sightseeing also includes visits to the villages of Ortahisar and Uchisar with their curious rock formations and rock-cut houses. We'll walk through the underground city of Kaymakli, where an entire village of Christians lived in a system of subterranean caves and tunnels. Finally, we'll visit Turkey's Red River Valley and the village of Avanos, famous for its

pottery workshops and carpet weaving traditions, before we return to our hotel for dinner.

DAY FIVE, Tuesday, Nov 3 -- KONYA / LYSTRA / ANTALYA

We depart today for Konya. This was Iconium in Paul's day, where he spent one entire winter (Acts 14:1-7,21). On the way we visit Sultan Hani to see a caravanserai (ancient caravan motel). Remains of Iconium are buried beneath the medieval buildings of the Selcuk Turks. While in Konya we may also see the famous Whirling Dervishes.

We continue to Antalya on the "Turquoise Coast," so called because of the exquisite blue color of the sea. On the way we stop at ancient Lystra which Paul visited on several occasions (Acts 14:6-12; 16:1), healed a lame man and ordained elders of the church (Acts 14:21,23) We continue over the Taurus Mountains arriving at our hotel in Antalya on the Mediterranean.

DAY SIX, Wednesday Nov 4 -- PERGE / ASPENDOS / ANTALYA

Today we enjoy a full day excursion to the archaeological sites in Perge where St. Paul landed on his first missionary journey (Acts 13:13; 14:25). Perge was founded by the legendary heroes of the Trojan War. In 333 B.C. Alexander the Great visited the city and it prospered under Roman rule until the fourth century A.D. Today the site is one of the most impressive in Turkey with a fine Greco-Roman theater whose stage is richly decorated with reliefs of mythological scenes. Nearby Aspendos boasts probably the best preserved Roman Theater anywhere in the world.

DAY SEVEN, Thursday Nov 5 -- ANTALYA / PAMUKKALE

We travel today to Pamukkale, world famous for its volcanic spring water that cascades over steep, natural terraces to form pools. These are magnificent natural phenomena created over the millennia as hot mineral-saturated water bursts from the underground to create a fairy-tale-like scene.

Before we enjoy a relaxing swim in the thermal waters, we'll visit Hierapolis, which is adjacent to Pamukkale. The ruins of the ancient city cover more than a mile. We see the impressive amphitheater with seats still in perfect condition, the city gates, and column-lined streets and arches which have stood through time and earthquakes. Christianity came to Hierapolis when the Apostle Paul arrived here (Colossians 4:13).

The rest of the day is to relax. We're just over the half-way point in our adventure in Turkey and I know you'll appreciate the rest. Imagine soaking in the same waters as did Mark Anthony and Cleopatra.

"THE SEVEN CHURCHES"

DAY EIGHT, Friday Nov 6 -- COLOSSE / LAODICEA / KUSADASI

Over the next few days the Bible becomes more alive as we visit the remains of the "seven Church of the Revelation." While famous in the first century, today the town of Colosse has fallen into obscurity. Yet, we see traces of the theater, the necropolis, and the church.

The Church at Laodicea was chastened in Revelation as being "lukewarm" (Rev. 3:16). You'll understand the meaning of these Scriptures much better when you see that ancient Laodicea was situated at the foot of the

mountain from which the thermal waters of Hierapolis descended almost five miles via an aqueduct. By the time the water reached Laodicea it was "lukewarm."

On the way to Kusadasi we stop at the impressive Roman archaeological site of Aphrodisias, location of one of the greatest schools of sculpture in antiquity. We'll see a stadium which seated 30,000, the Temple of Aphrodite, and the theater and baths of Hadrian. We arrive in Kusadasi in late afternoon for shopping and overnight.

DAY NINE, Saturday Nov 7 -- FABULOUS EPHESUS Ephesus was one of the five major cities of the ancient world. The Apostle Paul ministered here for two years, the Apostle John stayed here for an extended period as did, according to tradition, the Virgin Mary. Ephesus is incredible. We see among the numerous ruins the Library, the Agora, the Theater where 28,000 angry citizens railed against Paul (Acts 19). Then we'll see one of the seven wonders of the ancient world, the Temple of Diana or Artemis and stop by the Basilica of St. John and the House of the Virgin Mary. This is a full day, but one you will never forget. Ephesus is perhaps the most impressive ruins of the ancient world.

DAY TEN, Sunday Nov 8 -- PHILADELPHIA / SARDIS / SMYRNA

We visit two more of the seven churches today. To the church at Philadelphia the Spirit wrote, "Because you have kept the word of my perseverance, I will keep you from the hour of testing" (Rev. 3:10). Only ruins of an ancient wall and a Byzantine basilica mark the site of this church, located in modern Alasehir. Sardis, now known as Sart, was berated by the Spirit for its façade of strength when it really was weak (Rev. 3:1-6). The massive scale of the ruins of the Temple of Artemis, the while marble of the Royal Road, the gymnasium and synagogue are impressive. We overnight in Izmir, another of the seven churches (Smyrna) to which the Spirit said, "Be faithful until death, and I will give you the crown of life" (Rev. 2:10).

DAY ELEVEN, Monday Nov 9 -- PERGAMUM / THYATIRA / IZMIR

The most favored of the seven churches was Pergamos, located in modern Bergama. Towering a thousand feet above the town is the fabled Acropolis. The Grand Theater, on the slopes of the Acropolis, is one of the steepest grandstands in the world. As we pass through the Royal Gates we see the foundations of the Temple of Zeus, the Temple of Athena and the ruins of the Library which once held 200,000 parchment volumes. We see also the remains of the Temple of Trajan, the Gymnasium, and the Asclepiad.

Later this afternoon we drive south to Thyatira, located near modern Akhisar. Once known as a "seller of purple," it is now famous for its Persian rugs. As one of the seven churches (Rev. 1:11; 2:18-29), it was censured for its tolerance of immorality and false doctrine. Then it's back to Izmir for dinner and overnight.

DAY TWELVE, Tuesday Nov 10 -- IZMIR / ISTANBUL

This morning we fly from Izmir to Istanbul to see the highlights of this beautiful city. Is it in Europe or in Asia? It's in both, actually. We'll visit the Rustem Pasha Mosque, the Topkapi Palace, and the Hagia Sophia. Then we go to the Blue Mosque, and the Hippodrome. We'll end our day with a visit to the Spice Market where you can buy all those exotic Turkish delights. Then it's dinner and overnight in mysterious Istanbul.

DAY THIRTEEN, Wednesday Nov 11-- ISTANBUL / CHICAGO

Wow. What a journey we've had. But as they say, "All good things must come to an end." This morning we fly from Istanbul to Chicago. These two weeks will open your eyes to the Scriptures like nothing else will. Whether you've been to the Holy Land or not, now that you've visited "The Other Holy Land" you have the rest of the story.

TERMS AND CONDITIONS

ACCOMMODATIONS: First class hotels based on twin occupancy with bath. Hotel category determined through documentation published by O.H.R.G. Single-room supplement \$35 per night.

MEALS: Continental breakfast (in Israel the famous Israeli buffet), and dinner daily throughout the tour. Extra charge for coffee, tea or other beverage not included in the menu of the day.
